## **Southwest Agricultural Conference 2020**



The 27<sup>th</sup> Southwest Agricultural Conference was held January 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> 2020 at the University of Guelph, Ridgetown Campus. The conference was sold out ahead of the registration deadline for the second year in a row with over 1,350 registered for each day. The weather was exceptional once again this



year making travel to the conference easier for the speakers and participants.

The theme of this year's conference was "2020 Ag Vision" and presented topics included sessions on soil health, capturing carbon, weed, insect and disease management, new technologies, labour management, nutrient management, grain marketing, new crop opportunities.

The feature speaker session on the first day was Dr. Tom Deans who shared inspirational messages on family success and provided some insights into the way we think about farm succession planning.



On day two, Michael Landsberg shared an inspirational message on mental health. He opened up about his own struggles in order to help us understand that mental health isn't a weakness and how we can beat the stigma and save lives.

The livestreaming of the sessions occurred again this year on January 8<sup>th</sup> with over 128 individuals participating from across Ontario. Various groups also organized satellite locations in Sturgeon Falls, Picton and Thornloe, Ontario as well as Kentville, Nova Scotia. The sessions were well received, and it is a great way to deliver this high-quality program to those who may not wish to travel to Ridgetown or who may not have the same access to speakers.

The format of the conference is seven 50-minute concurrent sessions, plus the feature speaker, so it is a full day of learning! The presenters are a mix of farmers, researchers, government extension staff and agriculture industry personnel. The goal of the

conference is to bring in the best speaker possible for each topic.
