### Resolution #5 – Norfolk-Renfrew SCIA – OSCIA Membership fee increase

- **WHEREAS** OSCIA has operated financially independent of the local associations for much of its existence collecting a minimal membership fee from the local associations accounting for less than 3% of total budget in 2020, and;
- **WHEREAS** The OSCIA Board of Directors have decided to raise the annual membership fee from \$7.50 to \$25 (233% increase) beginning in 2023, and;
- **WHEREAS** In the last two years most associations have operated virtually and remotely.
- **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the OSCIA provide the local associations with a breakdown of the additional value the OSCIA will be providing to the local associations with the increased provincial organization fee that the OSCIA will collect.
- **FURTHERMORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that OSCIA provides a detailed report to the members on how the association is "working on additional cost saving measures and other ways of generating income" that can be used to justify this increase to members with the end result of retaining as many current members as possible.
